Task Force Organization
 The task force is based on 18-25 members – Quarterly meetings: Members serve 2-year terms Staff support by DPH Office of Planning & Development Selections made by each Board Supervisor
Task Force Leadership
The task force is led by two Co-Chairs selected by vote of the entire task force membership: • Co-Chair's terms is limited to one 2-year term • Elected in June 2016

Commissioner Crawford asked about any positive/negative feedback to date.
 Ms. De La Rosa stated selected members of the task force have been very collaborative and open minded. Its members are in the process of defining their roles in terms of community groups they represent: Oversee health equity and Public Health
Commissioner Crawford asked about the Task Force meetings and any gender equity or, specific health inequity discussions on both male/female.
Ms. Haberman stated the Task Force will look at sources of equity and disparities. She stated CHIP highlights disparities for twenty measurable targets.
Commissioner Crawford expressed the importance of addressing gender equity/inequity. It doesn't only impact men but women as well.

		Commission Chair Bholat asked about the 45 strategies DPH is accountable for. She stated that focusing on all disparities is crucial as well as the exclusiveness of other populations, and reaching implications for lower middle class and middle class people. Commission Chair Bholat stated convening with partners is crucial. Ms. Haberman stated one of the CHIP's strategies is to develop a health impact assessment in affordable housing policy in LAC. Commission Chair Bholat commented on Opioid drugs. She stated there is a large problem in ages 18-29, and 60% of high school kids drinking and driving. She suggested an invitation to DPH SAPC to discuss drugs and its policies, the historical differences between Cocaine, and racial implications. Commissioner Crawford suggested encouraging the LAC Office of Women's Health attend future Task Force meetings for public comment on gender lends. Ms. Haberman informed the Commission on the launching of CHIP with stakeholders in November 2015. She stated a special meeting was conducted with SAPC on OPIOIDs and drugs that disproportionately affect communities of color. Commission Chair Bholat thanked Ms. Haberman for a great presentation.
